About the Instructor

John Nelson, President of Audubon of Martin County, is a nature photographer and videographer, and voice of *The Audubon Moment* heard on several NPR stations including WQCS 88.9 FM, NPR for the Treasure Coast.

About the Workshop

This is your opportunity to learn from a professional photographer how to get the most out of your camera to make great nature and wildlife photos. Bring your own equipment. - complete list provided at sign-up. The workshop starts in the Elliott Museum's Heritage Theater for a classroom-style session to learn about your camera, be it DSLR or point-and-shoot with manual settings. John will show examples and give demonstrations on shooting. Adjourn to the Art Studio at noon for lunch (included in the fee!) and then across the street to Stuart Beach (weather permitting) to look for live subjects in the tree or on the wing, and natural landscapes. Return to the Theater to review your work and get a critique from John. **Bonus:** Each participant may submit their best photo to be displayed in the Museum's art studio from April 8th - 18th!
